Look out for the red and white Plunket marquee near the main pavilion.

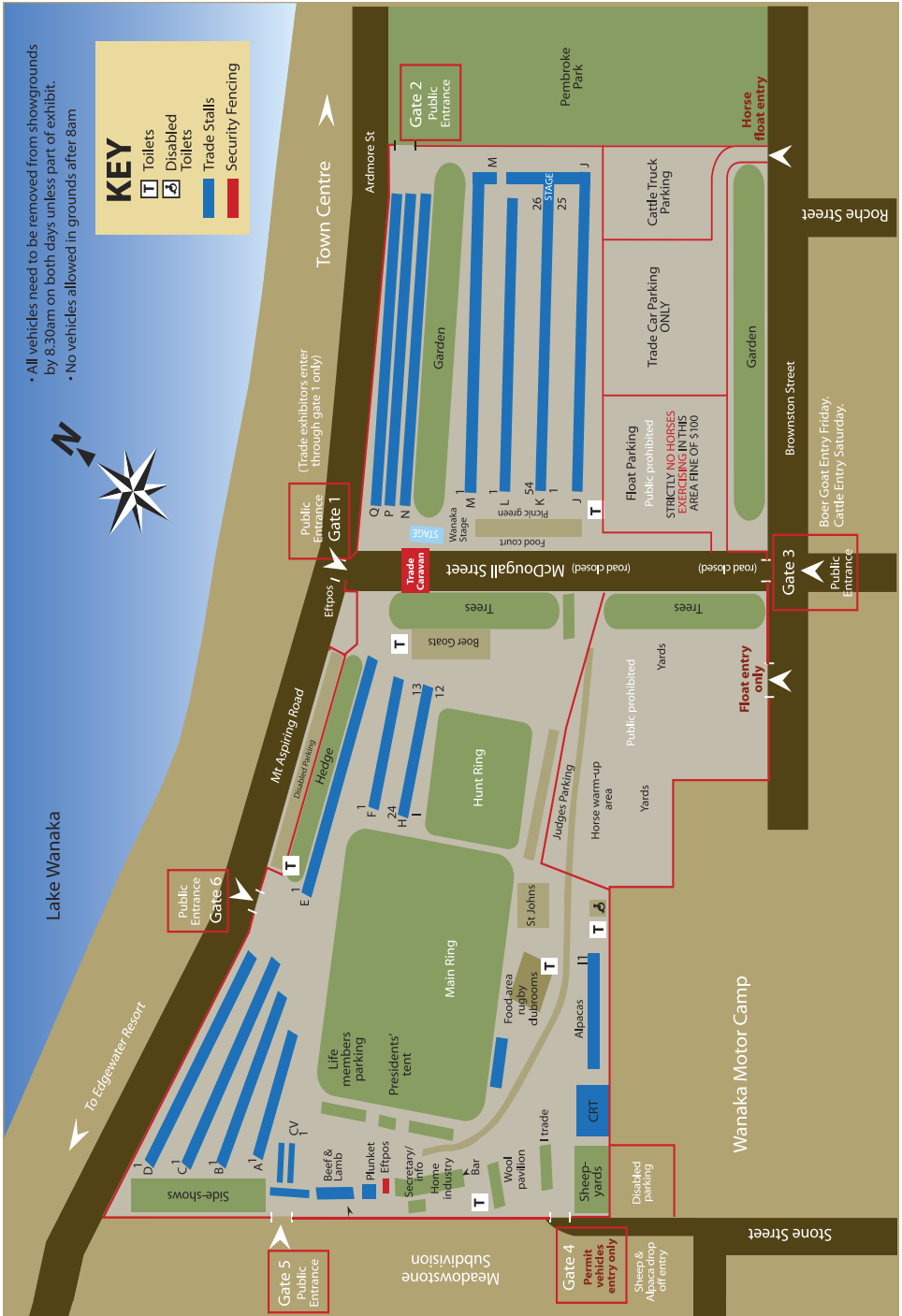

Rules and Conditions

- E1a. LOCALS: refers to competitors residing within the areas bounded by Lindis Saddle, Makarora; Crown Range; Victoria Bridge and Cromwell.
- E1b. CENTRAL OTAGO: refers to competitors of Central Otago Pony Clubs at Maniototo; Clyde; Cromwell; Wakatipu and Hawea/ Wanaka, and must wear pony club uniform and be a current financial member.

Age and Height. Rider and Horse

- E2a. Open ponies must be ridden by riders 16 years and under; age except that riders turning 17 after Jan 1st are able to ride ponies until 31st July of the same year, with the exception of Novice ponies, they may be ridden by riders of any age.
- E2b. The age of the competitor is to be taken as of the first day of the Show with the exception of the rule above.
- E2c. Riders 16 years and under cannot compete in both Hack and Pony rings. Must be in one or the other.
- E2d. No Horse or Pony under 3 years old is permitted to be shown under saddle
- E2e. Ponies 14.2 and under excluded from all Hack events.

Eligibility

- E3a. Entires eligible provided that the RAS Rule 56 is complied with and that the Livestock Secretary is notified and satisfied that all requirements are fulfilled.
- E3b. **Stallions are not to be tied up unattended unless in an appropriate confinement. It is recommended that stallions be kept in approved suitable yards. At the time of entry, all stallion owners must be in the possession of a stallion identification badge, which must be displayed at the yard and on the horse at all times while at the Show. Official badges are available at a cost from NZEF.**
- E3c. **In the warm up area, a stallion must be accompanied by at least one attendant, in addition to the rider, and the stallion badge must be on the horse.**
- E3d. All horses and ponies entered in competitive classes or ring events or parading (whether by invitation or by entry) must be entered in the name of the bona fide owner. All animals must be named at time of entry.

Protests, Judges' & Committee's Rights

- E4a. The Stewards in the various classes are enjoined and empowered to prevent any persons interfering with the Judges during adjudication and no exhibitor or other person other than the Judge, Stewards and Livestock Secretary will be permitted to go inside the ring while the exhibits are being judged, except in such cases as the Stewards may deem necessary.
- E4b. The Committee may reserve the right to allot Specials in lieu of prize money mentioned in this schedule.
- E4c. All Protests to be lodged with the Livestock Secretary accompanied with a deposit of \$50, within half an hour of adjudication and if, in the opinion of the committee such protest is deemed frivolous, the deposit to be forfeited.
- E4d. The Committee will not under any circumstances hold itself responsible for any loss, damage or mis-delivery of stock or other exhibits at the Show.
- E4e. Any person infringing the rules of the Society will be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$50. The attention of exhibitors is particularly directed to the foregoing provisions which will be strictly enforced, or will revert to the funds of the Society.
- E4f. The decision of the Committee shall be absolutely final on any subject on Show Day.
- E4g. Officials have the power in the equestrian sections to move stock to their correct classes with the approval and on advice of Judges.
- E4h. Any exhibitor or person in any way interfering with or using improper language to the Judges or any officer of the Society in, or as to, the execution of their duty, or being guilty of improper conduct on the Showground, may be disqualified exhibiting in future shows of the Society,

- and if exhibiting at this Show, may forfeit all prizes he or she has won.
- E4i. Reservation of right. The organizers reserve the right:
- To cancel any class or event
 - To divide any class and amend prize money accordingly
 - To alter the advertised times
 - To refuse any entry (with or without stating a reason)
 - To alter or amend the programme as the organizer sees fit
 - **Any unruly or dangerous animal may be required to leave the Showground.**
- E4j. “This Show supports the RAS ‘Yellow Card’ system, which will operate in the Equestrian Section of all RAS affiliated Shows and will be offered for any inappropriate behaviour towards Show officials, Judges, fellow competitors or any other third party connected with the Show bringing the equestrian discipline into disrepute, or cases which are of a less serious nature to the above in accordance with the Conduct of Members, Owners, Lessees, Competitors and/ or Exhibitors as provided in the RAS Equestrian Competitors and Judges Rulebook and rule 13 of the RAS Constitution”

Novice Criteria

- E5a. A novice horse or pony is one that has yet to win six classes in any division within the competitions provided at any A&P Show.
- E5b. The owner of any horse or pony that has upgraded since their entry was received must notify the Livestock Secretary so that the necessary adjustments can be made. If a Horse or Pony has upgraded at another A & P show after entry has been received by the Livestock Secretary then no fee for alteration will apply providing proof of upgrade is shown and the Livestock Secretary is notified by 4pm on Monday 5th March.
- E5c. **Please note that a record of wins will be asked for. Horse/Pony height and performance cards must be carried. Failure to do so will result in elimination. All wins in Novice section within each division count and must be recorded. Should a novice horse win an Open conformation class, these wins must also be recorded. Once a horse has achieved 6 wins in either the conformation or Paced and Mannered, this horse is not eligible to return to Novice status should it change sections at the beginning of the new season. A Novice is a horse or pony which has not won 6 firsts in relevant classes at the time of the Show, not at the time of entry. See E5b for upgrade details.**

Entry Fees, Scratching, Refunds and Payouts

- E6a. All livestock entries close with the Livestock Secretary on **Monday February 6th 2012.**
- E6b. Entry Fees must accompany all entries. Late Entries will be charged an additional \$10. Refund of entry fees will only be considered if scratchings are made officially with the Livestock Secretary either prior to the Show or in sufficient time to avoid disruption to the smooth running of the competition.
i.e. full refund if scratching is made before Thursday 1st March. 75% refund if scratching is made before **Thursday 8th March 2012, 4pm.** No refund will be given after this time unless a vet certificate is produced. Yard fees will be refunded in full.
- E6c. If a veterinary certificate is produced refunds will be in full.
- E6d. All prize winners in horse, cattle, sheep and boer goat sections are expected to join in the Grand Parade.
- E6e. All prize money will be withheld on Saturday morning and can be collected at A & P Office after the Grand Parade upon presentation of Grand Parade Participation Ticket.
- E6f. All prize money must be claimed within **three weeks** after the Show.
- E6g. The Judges are empowered to withhold the prize-money in any department in which there are not sufficient entries.
- E6h. Competitors may not receive ribbon, cards or money unless they can produce their Height and Performance Card upon request in a height specific class.
- E6i. All wins in novice and open classes within each division count and must be recorded on the Royal Agricultural Society Performance and Measuring Card. Winners failing to produce their card when requested by the Steward forfeit their awards for the day.
- E6j. Class changes – same combination wishing to change classes incur a transfer fee of \$2 per class. An upgrade will not incur any fee apart from any difference in entry fee. A scratching and entering on a new horse will incur a flat fee of \$10. A late entry on the day will incur a fee of \$10.
- E6k. Equestrian Levies – entry fee includes RAS Levy of \$1 per class.

Forbidden Substances

- E7a. Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show and that testing of all animals is at the owner's risk. Testing for forbidden substances will be carried out under the Royal Agricultural Society Forbidden Substances Judicial Committee (FSJC) procedures and rules (refer rule 89 Equestrian Judges and Competitors Rule Book).
- E7b. The use of tranquilizers, stimulants or any drugs capable of affecting the performance of horses and ponies is forbidden.

Championship Judging and Points Prizes

- E8a. Any pony qualifying for judging of Champion must be ridden in that event by the same rider as in classes. In the event of injury or sickness, exception to the rule may be made at the discretion of the Ring Steward.
- E8b. Points for Special Prizes in the aggregate: first 5, second 3, third 1, unless otherwise specified.
- E8c. The judging for the Pembroke Challenge Trophy is as follows.
The points awarded for the Jumping Round are added to the points on the flat - which is judged by a separate judge, and the highest combined total is the winner.

Ground Rules

- E9a. Temporary Pens - pens constructed of electric fence tape and electric fence standards are not permitted at affiliated shows.
- E9b. Only one person in charge of each lot of Horses, Cattle, Alpacas, Boer Goats or Sheep will be admitted free.
- E9c. All horses to be led by the head and in the charge of a competent person.
- E9d. When horses or ponies are entered in more than one class and the starting times clash, the exhibitor must elect which class they will start the horse or pony in. The programme will not be held up for horses or ponies competing in another ring. Horses or ponies arriving at the ring after the judging has commenced will be disqualified.
- E9e. Admission to the Showground: Adults \$10, All School Children Free. Members free on presentation of ticket.**
- E9f. Any person having been expelled from membership, or disqualified from exhibiting, riding or competing by any kindred association shall not be allowed to become a member, or to exhibit, ride or compete at this Society's exhibitions, until such expulsion be rescinded or such disqualification be removed, provided such expulsion or disqualification be confirmed by the Executive of this Society.
- E9g. Arrears: No person who is in arrears with regard to entry fees, subscriptions or any other Show charge is eligible to compete at any A & P Show. Proof of payment will be required before any restriction will be lifted.
- E9h. Whips must not be over 76cm in length and with a suitable flapper, with the exception in First Ridden where the whip must not exceed 68cm including the flapper.
- E9i. Please ensure that the yards are cleaned out after use and all rubbish put in the skips provided.
- E9j. Copies of the RAS Equestrian Rule Book can be pre-ordered at time of entry, \$35 per book.
- E9k. It is an offence to carry any form of electronic equipment or audio attachment for the purpose of sideline communication by trainers.
- E9l. Yard allocation: Due to the high demand the following criteria will apply
- ☞ Members will get first priority
 - ☞ Those travelling long distances
 - ☞ Those with multiple horses and staying 2 nights or more.
- E9m. In no case may horses or ponies be ridden outside the designated area. Pembroke Park carries a \$100 fine if caught exercising out there.**
- E9n. There will be no measuring during the Show. Upper Clutha A&P cannot take any responsibility if a horse is not measured before the Show.**
- E9o. Only competitors who have horses entered may park their truck in the main yard area.**
- E9p. PLEASE use Gate # 3 entrance.**

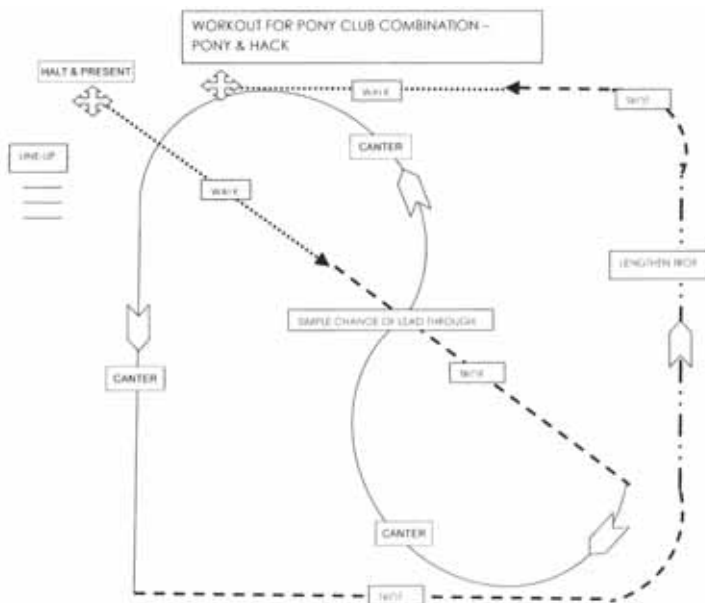

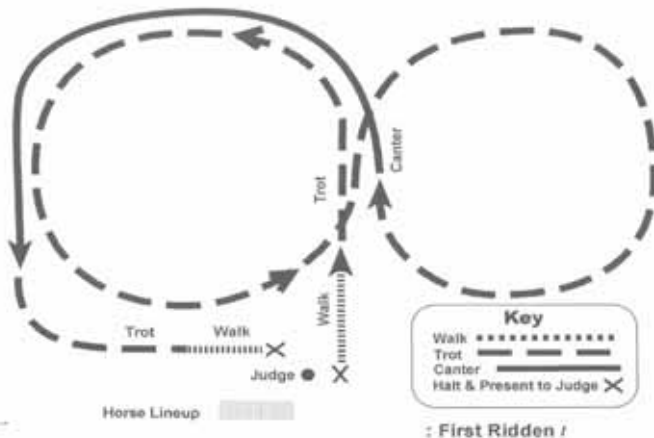

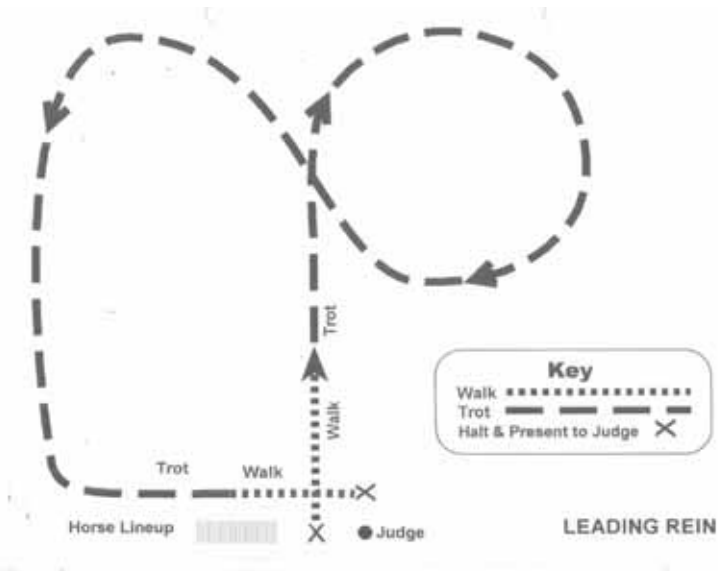

- C1a. T.B. TESTING - All cattle 1 month and over, must come from herds with a TB status of C2 or greater. All exhibitors are required to complete the Animal Health Board TB declaration form, declaring that all cattle shown have been TB tested in the last 12 months.
A copy of their test certificate and the AHB TB form must accompany the entry form.
- C1b. DECLARED MOVEMENT CONTROL AREA: In this case, cattle must be tested within the preceding 60 days and a copy of their test certificate accompanies the entry form.
- C1c. EARTAGS: All cattle must be tagged to Animal Health Board specifications or have an exemption permit. Ring 0800 4Tb info.
- C1d. HALTERED: All cattle must be haltered and be capable of being led. All bulls born before December last, must be led by a ring through the nose, and under adequate adult supervision. Failure to observe this can mean the animal can be disqualified from parading.
- C1e. CATTLE AGE: Cattle age shall be computed as at 1st June.
- C1f. The date of birth of all Breeds of Cattle must be stated at time of entry. In all classes breeding cows over 2 years must have calf at foot (unless otherwise stated). All purebred cattle must be led into the show ring when required by Stewards or Judges.
- C1g. In all classes of female stock, judges to withhold awards for cattle which, in their opinion, are barren.
- C1h. All pedigree cattle one year old and over must be entered in a recognised herd book.
- C1i. New ruling from RAS that 'a valid RAS Highland Passport must accompany Highland Cattle entries into RAS classes. Entries received without a passport will not be accepted'.**

Protests, Judges' & Committee's Rights

- C2a. **The Stewards** in the various classes are enjoined and empowered to prevent any persons interfering with the Judges during adjudication and no exhibitor or other person other than the Judge, Stewards and Livestock Secretary will be permitted to go inside the ring while the exhibits are being judged, except in such cases as the Stewards may deem necessary.
- C2b. The Committee may reserve the right to allot Specials in lieu of prize money mentioned in this schedule.
- C2c. **All Protests** to be lodged with the Livestock Secretary accompanied with a deposit of \$50, within half an hour of adjudication and if, in the opinion of the committee such protest is deemed frivolous, the deposit to be forfeited.
- C2d. The Committee will not under any circumstances hold itself responsible for any loss, damage or mis-delivery of stock or other exhibits at the Show.
- C2e. Any person infringing the rules of the Society will be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$50. The attention of exhibitors is particularly directed to the foregoing provisions which will be strictly enforced or will revert to the funds of the Society.
- C2f. Any exhibitor or person in any way interfering with or using improper language to the Judges or any officer of the Society in, or as to, the execution of their duty, or being guilty of improper conduct on the Showground, may be disqualified from exhibiting in future shows of the Society, and if exhibiting at this Show, may forfeit all prizes they have won.

- C2g. The decision of the committee shall be absolutely final on any subject on Show Day.
- C2h. Officials have the power in Cattle Section to move stock to their correct classes with the approval and on advice of judges.
- C2i. Any person having been expelled from membership, or disqualified from exhibiting, riding or competing by any kindred association shall not be allowed to become a member, or to exhibit, ride or compete at this Society's exhibitions, until such expulsion be rescinded or such disqualification be removed, provided such expulsion or disqualification be confirmed by the Executive of this Society.
- C2j. Arrears: No person who is in arrears with regard to entry fees, subscriptions or any other show charge is eligible to compete at any A & P Show. Proof of payment will be required before any restriction will be lifted.
- C2k. **The Judges** are empowered to withhold the prize-money in any department in which there are not sufficient funds.
- C2L. If a class has to be split for judging, then the first placegetters will be judged together if there is a Special Prize allocated solely to that Class.**

Ground Rules

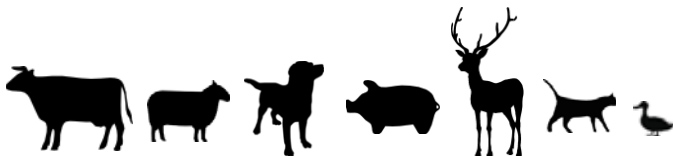

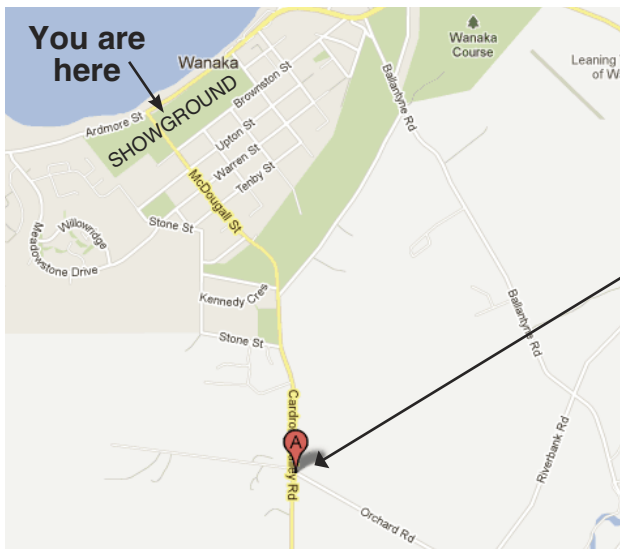

SHEAF TOSSING

The Origin of Sheaf Tossing

The origin of sheaf tossing came about before we had mobile harvesters. All grain crops, ie oats barley and wheat being the main crops, were reaped by a binder that made the sheaf. A sheaf was about 30cm in diameter tied with a piece of string around the middle, and weighing about 10kgs. Some grass crops were also handled this way ie cocksfoot, timothy fescue. Eight to ten sheaves made a stook which was left for 10 to 14 days to ripen. Oats in the early days was subject to shaking the grain out before it was harvested. However by putting it in a sheaf the grain was retained in the sheaf. At the time of harvest the sheaves were pitch forked onto a dray and carted to a stationary mill which took 3 to 4 men to operate. Many were driven by traction engines before tractors came onto the scene. So hence in the early days sheaf tossing was a keen competition at shows and other functions.

- F2b. All fleeces to be properly skirted as required by trade.
- F2c. All fleeces must be the property of a bona fide farmer, but it is not necessary that the exhibitor be the breeder of the sheep.
- F2d. Fleeces to be judged on the Society's recognised score-card and a card will be placed on each fleece by the judge. Competitor's name will be added but only after completion of all judging.
- F2e. Exhibitors to forward with each fleece a card approximately 10cm by 15cm showing the exhibitor's name and fleece type eg x-bred hogget fleece or stud merino ram etc.
- F2f. All Fleece Wool entries close with the Livestock Secretary **before 11am on Thursday 8th March 2012.**
- F2g. Fleeces nominated for Wool Export will be entered by the Society, who will not be responsible for fees or exhibiting.
- F2h. If no notification that wool is to be returned, or as to how to return, the wool becomes the property of the Society if not collected by lunchtime on **Monday 12th March 2012.**

Protests, Judges' & Committee's Rights

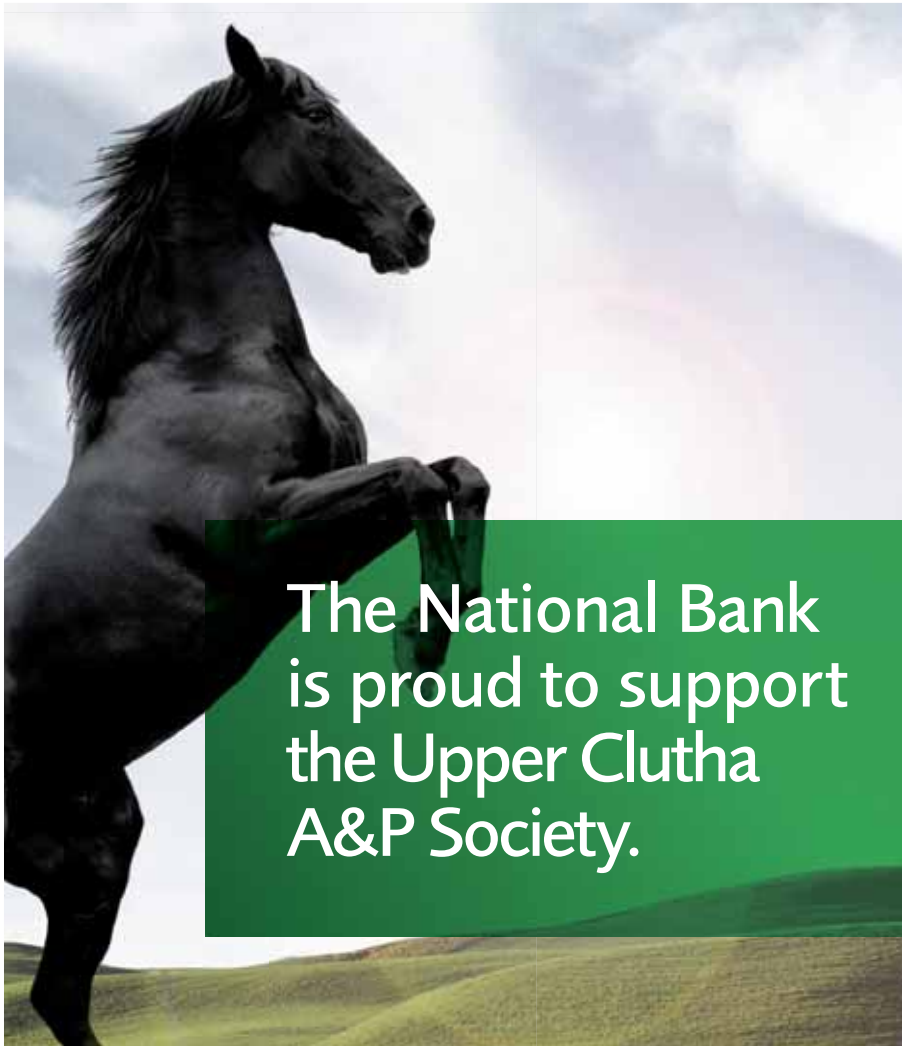
