COVID 19

STAY HOME IF YOU'RE UNWELL

Play it safe. Stay home if you're feeling unwell. If you have symptoms of COVID-19, get tested.

See information about the common COVID-19 symptoms and who to contact to talk about whether you need a test.

USE BASIC HYGIENE

Basic hygiene measures include: good hand hygiene, cough and sneeze etiquette, avoid touching your face, and clean surfaces.

- **Wash your hands** with soap and water often (for at least 20 seconds) and dry thoroughly. Use an alcohol-based sanitiser and rub hands together if soap and water is unavailable.
- **Cough or sneeze into your elbow** or cover your mouth and nose with tissues. Put them in a bin immediately.
- **Avoid touching your face**, including your eyes, nose or mouth if your hands are not clean. Surfaces may have infectious droplets.
- **Clean surfaces regularly.** This includes items frequently touch like door handles and phones.

KEEP A RECORD OF WHERE YOU HAVE BEEN

If cases of COVID-19 are confirmed, we need to stop the spread. Keeping a record of your movements will help the Ministry of Health to do contact tracing quickly and efficiently.

It is recommended you keep a record of where you have been, when you were there and who you were with.



WANAKA A&P SHOW SUSTAINABILITY

The Upper Clutha A&P Show is working towards becoming more sustainable by reducing our waste and recycling volume by implementing the following sustainability guidelines:

- No single use coffee cups
- No single-use plastic bottles – We are encouraging food stall holders to provide beverages in aluminium cans and we will be providing water stations around the Show Grounds where drink bottles can be refilled.
- Food court sustainability hub – We will create a sustainability hub at either end of the main food court that has signage educating people what goes into each bin.
- Compost – our sustainability hubs will include compost bins for food scraps to help reduce the amount of waste going in the rubbish bins.

These sustainable practices will be implemented over three years and we will be strongly encouraging all trade exhibitors abide by our sustainability guidelines. Our goal is by 2024 the sustainability guidelines will become rules that all who attend the Show must adhere to
