- Stem or cluster means more than one flower & including side buds.

Definition of a quilt: Quilting is the term given to the process of joining a minimum of three layers of fabric together either through stitching manually using a needle and thread, or mechanically with a sewing machine. The three layers are typically referred to as the top fabric or quilt top, batting or insulating material and the backing.
