

Please abide by the safety rules and signage at the Showgrounds. Follow instructions from Marshalls and Show officials.

In the event of an emergency, please follow ALL instructions given to you by Show Staff.

Parents ensure that children do not enter livestock pens or enclosures. DO NOT poke, hit or irritate animals. Be aware of stock movement when walking through the livestock areas. Please ensure that you and children in your care do not stand behind horses, cows and bulls. They may not see you there.

If visiting the Show with small children we suggest you write your cell phone number on their arm. Should they become separated from you; staff can then easily notify you. A Parent Centre and Lost Child Centre is located at the Plunket Tent on Pembroke Park.

The roads within the Showgrounds are open for emergency and Show vehicles, as well as horses, cattle and other livestock, particularly around the Main Arena. Be aware of vehicular and animal traffic around the Showgrounds particularly if you have children in your care.

Show Information Centre is located near the Food Court on McDougall Street.

- Any other livestock, including equine & dairy -as per rule 3 under Health & Safety, RAS Showing Rules & Regulations.

ii. Inappropriate behaviour towards Show Officials, Judges, fellow competitors or any other third party connected with the RAS affiliated Show/Event, including registered Measuring stands and their grounds,

bringing the A&P movement into disrepute, or cases which are of a less serious nature to the above in accordance with the Conduct of Members, Owners, Lessees, Competitors and/or exhibitors as provided.

- Equine -refer to the RAS Equestrian Competitors and Judges Rulebook
- All Persons responsible, including equestrian -refer to rule 8 under Disruptive or Unacceptable Behaviour, RAS Showing Rules or Regulations.

Rule 13 of the RAS Constitution

Inappropriate behaviour constitutes any behaviour deemed by the President of the Show or their duly appointed delegate and/or Chief Steward of the Section/Stand involved that brings the A&P movement into disrepute including but not limited to inappropriate language, swearing, cheating or deliberately attempting to work outside of the generally accepted show rules and protocols. This also extends to inappropriate written communication via Facebook, Twitter, text, on-line forums and the like'.

DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Neither the organisers of the event to which these rules apply nor any agent, employee or representative of these bodies accepts any liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, spectators, land, vehicles, their contents and accessories or any other personal property whatsoever whether caused by their negligence, breach of contract, or in any other way whatsoever.

NB. Under law it is not possible to sign a waiver which would protect a facility owner, farmer, employer or other person from liability should an accident occur as a result of neglect to take all practicable steps. The facility owner, local authority or farmer etc cannot "contract" out such responsibilities by requesting a waiver of liability. All practicable steps have been taken by the organisers to ensure your safety and we ask you to take particular heed of hazard signs that have been posted, and avoid these areas.

RULES AND CONDITIONS

E1a. LOCALS: refers to competitors residing within the areas bounded by Lindis Saddle, Makarora, Crown Range, Victoria Bridge and Cromwell.

E1b. CENTRAL OTAGO: refers to competitors of Central Otago Pony Clubs at Maniototo, Clyde, Cromwell, Wakatipu and Hawea/ Wanaka. Must wear pony club uniform and be a current financial member.

E1c. All livestock entries close with the Livestock Secretary on MONDAY 16TH FEBRUARY 2026.

E1d. Entry Fees must accompany all entries. Late Entries will be charged an additional 10% per class. Refund of entry fees will only be considered if scratchings are made officially with the Livestock Secretary either prior to the Show or in sufficient time to avoid disruption to the smooth running of the competition. i.e. Full refund, excluding Admin/Ground Fee if scratching is made before Monday 2nd March 2026. No refund will be given after this time unless a vet certificate is produced. Yard fees will be refunded in full.

E1e. If a veterinary certificate is produced refunds will be in full excluding Admin/Ground Fee (\$30)

E1f. Equestrian Levies - entry fee includes RAS Levy of \$1.25 per class.

E1g. Admission to the Showground: For more information, please visit the website www.wanakashow.co.nz

E1h. Each RIDER will be issued with 1 x 2-day pass. Additional tickets must be purchased prior to the show via the website - www.wanakashow.co.nz

E1i. Security staff will be on duty from Thursday 6pm-7am Friday; Friday 6pm - Saturday 7am; Saturday 6pm - Sunday 9am.

E1j. FALL OF RIDER: If a rider has a fall or suspected head injury, at any time at a RAS affiliated Show/Event in the: competition ring/arena, practice/warmup/collecting ring/arena; or elsewhere within the grounds of where the show/event is being convened, the rider must be removed from the activity and checked by the show/event's nominated First Aid service/ personnel and be given the 'all-clear' before the rider is permitted to re-mount and continue riding at the show/event.

Age and Height. Rider and Horse as of 1st August 2025

E2a. Open pony exhibits must be ridden by riders under seventeen years of age. Novice ponies may be ridden by riders of any age.

E2b. Rider/Handler's age and eligibility is determined as per the 1st of August i.e., Riders/Handlers who are of age for any division/section on the 1st of August complete the show year/ season in that division/section.

E2c. Riders 16 years and under cannot compete in both horse and pony classing rings. Must be in one or the other.

E2d. Exhibits 3 years of age and under are not permitted in any ridden or driven classes.

E2e. Ponies 148cm and under excluded from all horse events.

Eligibility

E3a. Stallions eligible provided that the RAS Rule CDE 14 is complied with and that the Livestock Secretary is notified and satisfied that all requirements are fulfilled.

E3b. Stallions are not to be tied up unattended unless in an appropriate confinement. It is recommended that stallions be kept in approved suitable yards. At the time of entry, all stallion owners must be in



the possession of a stallion identification badge, which must be displayed at the yard and on the horse always while at the Show. E3c. In the warmup area, a stallion must be accompanied by at least one attendant, in addition to the rider. It is compulsory for all stallions and colts, except foals, to wear two (2) official 'S' identification badges, one attached to each side of their bridle, at all Shows/Events at all times. The rider/handler must also wear two RAS official armbands (one on each arm) when in the ring. 'S' badges and armbands to be purchased from RAS Head Office or ESNZ.

E3d. All horses and ponies entered in competitive classes or ring events or parading (whether by invitation or by entry) must be entered in the name of the bona fide owner. All animals must be named at time of entry.

E3e. COH Classes 22 & 25. All entrants for these classes must be able to provide Hunt Qualification Cards showing that the horse/pony hunted with the Central Otago Hunt hounds at least three times during the season immediately prior to the show. These hunt cards must be photocopied, sent in with entries, and presented at time of presentation of ribbons. To receive a qualification card the rider/owner must be a financial member of COH.

E3f. COH Open Qualified Hunter Class 30. This class is open to current financial members of any Hunt. The horse must have hunted 3 times in the season immediately prior to the show. Official Hunt Qualification Cards must be signed by the Hunt Master & a copy sent in with entries plus be carried at time of competition.

E3g. First Ridden & Lead Rein are not eligible to enter Groups A, B, C, D, Utility or any other section of the show unless a Breed, First Ridden or Lead Rein class.

NOVICE CRITERIA & HEIGHT CERTIFICATES

E4a. A novice horse or pony is one that has yet to win six classes in any division within the competitions provided at any A&P Show.

E4b. The owner of any horse or pony that has upgraded since their entry was received must notify the Livestock Secretary so that the necessary adjustments can be made. If a Horse or Pony has upgraded at another A & P show after entry has been received by the Livestock Secretary

then no late fee for alteration will apply providing proof of upgrade is shown and the Livestock Secretary is notified by 4pm on Monday 9th March.

E4c. Please note that a record of wins will be asked for. Horse/Pony height and performance cards must be carried. Failure to do so will result in forfeiture of awards. All wins in Novice section within each division count and must be recorded. Should a novice horse win an Open conformation class, these wins must also be recorded. Once a horse has achieved 6 wins in either the conformation or Paced and Mannered, this horse is not eligible to return to Novice status should it change sections at the beginning of the new season. A Novice is a horse or pony which has not won 6 firsts in relevant classes at the time of the Show, not at the time of entry. See E4b for upgrade details.

E4d. There will be no measuring during the Show. Upper Clutha A&P cannot take any responsibility if a horse is not measured before the Show.

Championship Judging and Points Prizes

E5a. Any pony qualifying for judging of Champion must be ridden in that event by the same rider as in classes. In the event of injury or sickness, exception to the rule may be made at the discretion of the Ring Steward.

E5b. Points for Special Prizes in the aggregate: first 5, second 3, third 1, unless otherwise specified.

PROTESTS, JUDGES & COMMITTEES RIGHTS

E6a. All Protests to be lodged with the Livestock Secretary accompanied with a deposit of \$50, within half an hour of adjudication and if, in the opinion of the committee such protest is deemed frivolous, the deposit to be forfeited.

E6b. Any person infringing the rules of the Society will be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$50. The attention of exhibitors is particularly directed to the foregoing provisions which will be strictly enforced, and penalties will revert to the funds of the Society.

E6c. Any exhibitor or person in any way interfering with or using improper language to the Judges or any officer of the Society in, or as to, the execution

of their duty, or being guilty of improper conduct on the Showground, may be disqualified upon exhibiting in future shows of the Society, and if exhibiting at this Show, may forfeit all prizes he or she has won.

E6d. The decision of the Committee shall be final on any subject on Show Day.

E6e. The Stewards in the various classes are enjoined and empowered to prevent any persons interfering with the Judges during adjudication and no exhibitor or other person otherwise, than the Judge, Stewards, and Livestock Secretary will be permitted to go inside the ring while the exhibits are being judged, except in such cases as the Stewards may deem necessary.

E6f. The Committee may reserve the right to allot Specials in lieu of prize money mentioned in this schedule.

E6g. The Committee will not under any circumstances hold itself responsible for any loss, damage or mis-delivery of stock or other exhibits at the Show.

E6h. Reservation of right. The organizers reserve the right:

- To cancel any class or event.
- To divide any class and amend prize money accordingly.
- To alter the advertised times.
- To refuse any entry (with or without stating a reason)
- To alter or amend the programme as the organizer sees fit.
- To cap entry numbers regardless of entry closure date.
- To merge classes if entry numbers are low.
- To move an entry to their correct class with the approval and on advice of the Judge.
- Any unruly or dangerous animal may be required to leave the Showground.

E6i. Any person having been expelled from membership, or disqualified from exhibiting, riding or competing by any kindred association shall not be allowed to become a member, or to exhibit, ride or compete at this Society's exhibitions, until such expulsion be rescinded or such disqualification be removed, provided such expulsion or disqualification be confirmed by the Executive of this Society.

E6j. Arrears: No person who is in arrears regarding entry fees, subscriptions or any other Show charge is eligible to compete at any A & P Show. Proof of payment will be required before any restriction will be lifted.

CLASS RULES, RAS, CLEAN SPORT

Class Rules

E7a. All horses to be led by the head and in the charge of a competent person.

E7b. When horses or ponies are entered in more than one class and the starting times clash, the exhibitor must elect which class they will start the horse or pony in. At NO time can a substitute rider compete that horse/pony due to the clash, unless you have prior approval of the Head Equestrian Steward. The programme will not be held up for horses/ponies or riders competing in another ring. Horses or ponies arriving at the ring after the judging has commenced will not be allowed in the ring or be judged.

E7c. No rider is permitted to leave the classing ring to compete in another ring until they have been dismissed by the Ring Steward or if they are placegetter.

E7d. All placegetters must be presented by the rider who started in the class, until the completion of sashing unless there are extenuating circumstances, and the Chief Steward has been notified.

E7e. There will be no substitute riders after the section has started, (Exception: Novice classes, please see rule E7f) or if you have approval from the Chief Equestrian steward.

E7f. Novice pony exhibits (except Novice Pony Stallions) may be ridden by a rider of any age, in novice pony classes only.

E7g. Class changes – same combination wishing to change classes incur the late fee of 10% per class. CLASS CHANGES CAN ONLY BE MADE UP TO 30 MINUTES PRIOR TO THE START OF THE CLASS.

Royal Agricultural Society

E8a. Summary of the RAS In-Line Resolution Process – the full process can be found on the RAS website www.ras.org.nz. The principle behind the process is to deal with the matter as it comes to hand and in most cases, it should be dealt with directly within the show. If the matter is regarding an RAS official, the Show may request the assistance of the RAS Head Office as to how to deal with this in an appropriate manner.

E8b. It is an offence to carry any form of electronic equipment or audio attachment for the purpose of sideline communication by trainers.



E8c. Whips must not exceed 76cm in length including flap (2cm x 4 cm). Whips in Led Classes shall not exceed 120cm. Refer to all whip lengths in rulebook – ras.org.nz / equestrian section / rulebook page – GR 5 a)

E8d. The RAS In-Line resolution Process system applies; please read full rule wording under the General Information Section of this schedule.

E8e. **DISABLED EXHIBITORS.** Those exhibitors requiring an aid for assistance during competition may apply to the Royal Agricultural Society for an identification card. RAS, PO Box 44, Oxford 7430, telephone 022 567 7551. Disabled competitors are welcome at the Competition, however if you are on crutches or in a wheelchair or disabled in a way that limits your ability to control a horse the Wanaka A&P Equestrian Committee requires a plan to manage your horse to be received before 1st of March 2026 for review and approval. The purpose of this is to ensure the safety of all competitors and volunteers in the ring. The committee's decision will be final and binding.

Clean Sport / Protection of Horses

E9a. Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show and that testing of all animals is at the owner's risk. Forbidden substance – any substance capable of affecting the speed, stamina, courage or conduct of a horse, pony, donkey, or mule by its action upon the central nervous system or the cardio-vascular, respiratory, alimentary, digestive, musculoskeletal, or urogenital systems.

E9b. In cases of illness or injury during an Event, the Ground Jury will decide, after consulting the Veterinary Delegate, whether the Horse may continue in that or subsequent

GROUND RULES

E10a. Temporary Pens - pens constructed of electric fence tape and electric fence standards are not permitted at affiliated shows.

E10b. Please ensure that the yards are cleaned out after use and all rubbish put in the skips provided. Competitors leaving dirty yards will not be allocated yards the following year.

E10c. Yard allocation: Due to the high demand the following priority criteria will apply.

- Those travelling long distances.
- Those with multiple horses and staying 2 nights or more.
- Central Otago and Queenstown residents will only be allocated yards if sufficient available.
- Only horses/ponies entered will be allocated a yard.
- Entries received AFTER closing date will be last to be allocated yards.

E10d. All prize winners in horse, cattle, sheep and boer goat sections are expected to join in the Grand Parade.

E10e. In no case may horses or ponies be ridden outside the designated area. Pembroke Park carries a \$100 fine if caught exercising out there.

E 10f. **EQUINE FOCUS** have the exclusive rights for equine treatments for the duration on the show. Riders with their own personal systems (e.g., Equissage, Cyclossage etc) are only permitted to treat their own horses with these systems while at the venue for this event. E 10g. Gates will open at 11am Wednesday immediately preceding the first day of the show. No camping prior to this date.

E 10h. A camping fee of \$10 per vehicle per night will be applied.

E 10i. Wanaka A&P Show Liquor Rules apply to all overnight campers.

Vehicles

E11a All vehicles MUST display issued vehicle passes in the windscreen for the duration of the show.

E11b. PLEASE use Gate # 3 entrance off Brownston St for parking on Pembroke Park & to access the parking at the yards, enter through the gate off McDougall Street near the Camping Ground

E11c. No long-term camping permitted, maximum of 4 nights, camping application form must be filled out.

E11d. Only competitors who have horses entered may park their truck in the truck/float parking areas.

E11e. No caravans nor camper vans (unless it is towing the float) are permitted to park within the float parking area. Camping in tents is discouraged however if you stay within the total length of your vehicle +float (i.e. – camp to the side and within the parking lines) it will be at the discretion of the Parking Marshal.

E11f. Parking for all floats and horse trucks is available on the grounds in the designated areas with marshals ensuring that parking is available for all Exhibitors. Parking is entirely at the vehicle owner's risk. Any vehicles parked will be on the condition that the Wanaka A&P Society accepts no responsibility for any loss, theft, injury or damage to persons or vehicles, their contents, fittings.

E11g. The Wanaka A&P Society Committee reserves the right to remove any motor vehicle, float or caravan or any other form of trailer which is parked in any area or manner other than those prescribed by Wanaka A&P Committee without prior notice. ANY VEHICLE FOUND TO BE PARKED INSIDE THE SHOWGROUNDS WITHOUT AUTHORITY WILL BE REMOVED AT THE OWNERS EXPENSE.

Show Cancellation Policy

E12a. If the Show is abandoned or postponed due to any reason beyond the control of the Society, the Society is under no obligation to refund in whole or in part any payments made by the Exhibitors. Any refund will be at the sole discretion of the Society.

E12b The Society will not be liable for any delay or failure to perform its obligations to the extent that such delay or failure results from a Force Majeure Event and while the Force Majeure Event continues. The Society will give the Exhibitor written notice as soon as reasonably possible containing details of the circumstances giving rise to the Force Majeure Event. The Exhibitor acknowledges and agrees that it will not be entitled to any reimbursement of any fees paid where a Force Majeure Event disrupts the Show. The Society may in its absolute discretion refund in whole or in part, any payment made by the Exhibitor - or waive any payment the Exhibitor is liable to make under these Terms.

E12c. For the purposes of clause E12b "Force Majeure" means an event or occurrence which is beyond a party's reasonable control (including, without limitation, acts of God or the public enemy, flood, earthquake, storm, cyclone, tornado, hurricane, lightning, fire, explosion, epidemic, pandemic, war, embargoes, riot or civil disturbances, sabotage, expropriation, confiscation or requisitioning of facilities, the imposition of disabling exchange rate controls, orders or temporary or permanent injunctions of any duly constituted court of competent jurisdiction); and which the affected party could not have reasonably foreseen or taken reasonable measures to prevent.

Animal Welfare

E13a. Any animal within the Show Grounds from 11.00am Wednesday, preceding the show till 9.00am Sunday immediately post show is protected by our Animal Welfare Policy.

Please note that the Committee reserves the right to limit the entry numbers in a specific section and or class.

ONLY AT THE DISCRETION OF THE LIVESTOCK SECRETARY WILL AN ENTRY BE ACCEPTED AFTER 2nd MARCH 2026

CAMPING CODE OF CONDUCT

EQUESTRIAN CAMPING CODE OF CONDUCT

It is a unique privilege that we are allowed to camp on the Showgrounds during the event, we must all work together to protect the opportunity to do so. Issues relating to antisocial behaviour, alcohol and security breaches may result in the permit being revoked. Please read carefully and acknowledge that by camping at the Show you agree to abide by this code of conduct.

LIQUOR

This is the first year the Society will hold the Liquor Licence for the event. To hold this licence, the event must comply with the local council rules and the District Licence Board.

Any breach of these rules will result in no liquor licence being issued to the whole event.

Unfortunately, as the Showgrounds and Pembroke Park are in a QLDC Alcohol-free Zone there can be no alcohol consumed outside of permitted licenced areas; the police therefore have the authority to prosecute. NB: Equestrian and cattle camping areas are NOT permitted licenced areas.

NO BYO liquor is permitted.

PARKING PERSONNEL HAVE THE RIGHT TO RELOCATE YOU FROM YOUR CAMP SITE IF DEEMED NECESSARY.

ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR

Please respect our neighbours, show team, vendors, community, and fellow competitors. If you are staying in the equestrian/cattle camping area, please keep noise to an absolute minimum after 10pm and respect the onsite security personnel instructions. Instances of disruption will result in your entries not being accepted in the future.

UNAUTHORIZED ENTRY TO NON-CAMPING AREA



RULES & REGULATIONS

- S1a. In the Merino Sections, the onus of classification is on the Exhibitor. If in doubt, the Judges will be available for classification from 8.30am Friday till 9.00am and appropriate class changes will be made.
- S1c. Merinos should be shorn to have no more than 10mm on the 1st of August.
- S1d. Merino lambs should be born no earlier than 15th July.
- S1e. All adult ewes in the sheep classes must, in the Judge's opinion, have reared a lamb.
- S1f. All Romney Sheep entered must be in natural condition.
- S1g. All Merino entries to be held by the exhibitor.
- S1h. BRUCELLOSIS - All sheep entered in the Show must be from a flock currently accredited Brucellosis free. Entries will be accepted from ABF breeders with status being confirmed by Breed Societies. Brucellosis Certificates must accompany entries. Entries not meeting accreditation will not be accepted and will be returned by post.
- S1i. Any animal within the Show Grounds from 11.00am Wednesday, preceding the show till 9.00am Sunday, immediately post show is protected by our Animal Welfare Policy.

PRIME GIFT LAMB

- S2a. No entry fees.
- S2b. Lamb becomes property of the Society.
- S2c. To be judged on export value not necessarily heaviest weight.
- S2d. Entire lambs eligible.
- S2e. Prizemoney: 50% of the total value of Gift Lambs makes up the prize pool and is paid out. 40% of the pool goes to the winner; 30% for 2nd and 20% for 3rd, 10% for 4th. Winners will receive prize money by direct credit.

PROTESTS, JUDGES' & COMMITTEE'S RIGHTS

- S3a. The Judges are empowered to withhold the prizemoney in any department in which there are not sufficient funds.
- S3b. The Stewards in the various classes are enjoined and empowered to prevent any persons interfering with the Judges during adjudication and no exhibitor or other person other than the Judge, Stewards and Livestock Secretary will be permitted to go inside the ring/pen while the exhibits are being judged, except in such cases as the Stewards may deem necessary.
- S3c. All Protests to be lodged with the Livestock Secretary accompanied with a deposit of \$50, within half an hour of adjudication and if, in the opinion of the committee such protest is deemed frivolous, the deposit to be forfeited.
- S3d. Any person infringing the rules of the Society will be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$50. The attention of exhibitors is particularly directed to the foregoing provisions which will be strictly enforced, and penalties will revert to the funds of the Society.
- S3e. Any exhibitor or person in any way interfering with or using improper language to the Judges or any officer of the Society in, or as to, the execution of their duty, or being guilty of improper conduct on the Showground, may be disqualified from exhibiting in future Shows of the Society, and if exhibiting at this Show, may forfeit all prizes he or she has won.
- S3f. Any person having been expelled from membership, or disqualified from exhibiting, riding or competing by any kindred association shall not be allowed to become a member, or to exhibit, ride or compete at this Society's exhibitions, until such expulsion be rescinded or such disqualification be removed, provided such expulsion or disqualification be confirmed by the Executive of this Society.
- S3g. Arrears: No person who is in arrears with regard to entry fees, subscriptions or any other Show charge is eligible to compete at any A & P Show. Proof of payment will be required before any restriction will be lifted.

S6c. Entries to be on the ground and stock yarded by 8.30am Saturday. Judging to commence at 9am sharp and on no account will be delayed for exhibits not to hand. All judges are requested to be on the ground at 8.45am.

S6d. No exhibits can be removed from the ground before 4pm except with an order from the Chief Steward.

SHOW CANCELLATION POLICY

S7a. If the Show is abandoned or postponed due to any reason beyond the control of the Society, the Society is under no obligation to refund in whole or in part any payments made by the Exhibitors. Any refund will be at the sole discretion of the Society.

S7b. The Society will not be liable for any delay or failure to perform its obligations to the extent that such delay or failure results from a Force Majeure Event and while the Force Majeure Event continues. The Society will give the Exhibitor written notice as soon as reasonably possible containing details of the circumstances giving rise to the Force Majeure Event. The Exhibitor

acknowledges and agrees that it will not be entitled to any reimbursement of any fees paid where a Force Majeure Event disrupts the Show. The Society may in its absolute discretion refund in whole or in part, any payment made by the Exhibitor - or waive any payment the Exhibitor is liable to make under these Terms.

S7c. For the purposes of clause S7b "Force Majeure" means an event or occurrence which is beyond a party's reasonable control (including, without limitation, acts of God or the public enemy, flood, earthquake, storm, cyclone, tornado, hurricane, lightning, fire, explosion, epidemic, war, embargoes, riot or civil disturbances, sabotage, expropriation, confiscation or requisitioning of facilities, the imposition of disabling exchange rate controls, orders or temporary or permanent injunctions of any duly constituted court of competent jurisdiction); and which the affected party could not have reasonably foreseen or taken reasonable measures to prevent.

F1b. BLENHEIM AND CANTERBURY FLEECES TO BE AT THE CANTERBURY PGG WRIGHTSON WOOL STORE BY Tuesday 17th FEBRUARY.

Entry Criteria

F2a. All Stud and Flock Fleeces are to be tested by the New Zealand Wool Testing Authority. After testing, the fleece will be subjectively judged placed in the correct breed class whether Stud or Flock for judging.

F2b. All fleeces to be properly skirted as required by trade.

F2c. All fleeces must be the property of a bona fide farmer, but it is not necessary that the exhibitor be the breeder of the sheep.

F2d. Fleeces to be judged on the Society's recognised scorecard and a card will be placed on each fleece by the Judge. Competitor's name will be added but only after completion of all judging.

F2e. Exhibitors to forward with each fleece a card approximately 10cm by 15cm showing the exhibitor's name and fleece type, e.g., stud merino ram or flock merino ewe etc.

F2f. All Fleece Wool entries close with the Livestock Secretary before 17th February 2026

F2g. Fleeces become the property of the Society if not collected by luncheon on the Monday following the show.

F2h. Registered Stud exhibitors are NOT eligible to enter in Flock classes.

Protests, Judges' & Committee's Rights

F3a. Wool may not be removed from the Wool Pavilion without the consent of the Steward in charge.

F3b. The Judges are empowered to withhold the prizemoney in any department in which there are not sufficient entries.

F3c. In the event of low entries, the Committee has the discretion to combine classes to create better competition.

F3d. The Stewards in the various classes are enjoined and empowered to prevent any persons interfering with the Judges during adjudication and no exhibitor or other person other than the Judge, Stewards, and Livestock Secretary will be permitted to go inside the Wool Pavilion while the exhibits are being judged, except in such cases as the Stewards may deem necessary.

F3e. All Protests to be lodged with the Livestock Secretary accompanied with a deposit of \$50, within half an hour of adjudication and if, in the opinion of the committee such protest is deemed frivolous, the deposit to be forfeited.
